2. Note the Duration: Find its exact length, including transportation.
3. Work Backward: Subtract the tour duration and additional logistics time from your personal deadline.

Practical Example: You choose the “Cabo Escape Snorkel,” which is 3 hours and 15 minutes from start to finish.

- Personal Deadline: 3:00 PM at the tender dock.
- Logistics Buffer: Allow 30 minutes to get from the tour’s end point back to the tender pier.
- Tour End Time: Therefore, the tour must end by 2:30 PM.
- Tour Start Time: Working backward 3h15m, the tour must begin by 11:15 AM.
